PURPOSE

The mission of NW Reformed Theological Seminary prepares men and women to be the leaders of Gospel Ministries for serving God, shaping the church, and ministry all humanity and creation.

The Seminary has a subordinate aims the provision of theological training for other church officers and members with a view to effective ministries as stewards of Christ, and the communication of the fruits of the biblical, theological, apologetical, historical, and practical studies.

These purposes are pursued through the development of a community of teachers and scholars seeking together the meaning of Scripture and its interpretation for human life and the provision of facilities for theological research.

THE WESTMINSTER CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Westminster Confession of Faith is perhaps the most notable expression in creedal form of the truths of the bible. It was the work of that Assembly of divines that was called together by parliament and met in London, at Westminster Abbey, during the years 1643- 1648.

It was this assembly that also produced the Larger and Shorter Catechisms. Many churches as their doctrinal standards, subordinate to the Word of God, utilize the Confession and the Catechisms. The text of the Confession which composed of the Chapter I of the Holy Scripture to the Chapter XXXIII of the Last Judgment is in the form adopted by the Presbyterian Church in America and by the Orthodox Presbyterian Church and except for a few revisions, largely concerning the relation of the civil magistrate to the church, it agrees with the text of the original manuscript of the Confession.

DEGREE PROGRAMS

DEGREE PROGRAM

MASTER OF DIVINITY

A student who holds the Bachelor of Arts degree, or appropriate academic equivalents from approved institutions, and provides attestation of efficacy in Christian service may obtain the degree of Master of Divinity (M. Div.) upon the completion of the prescribed year of full-time study. The purpose of this program is to prepare the individual for the gospel ministry and to enable him to meet ecclesiastical requirements to be ordained.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

CREDENTIALS

A previously unregistered applicant at NW Reformed Theological Seminary must ordinarily present the following credentials to the Director of Admissions: North-West Reformed Theological Seminary, 12416 Bingham Ave. E, Tacoma, Washington and 5-12950 80th Ave Surry BC V3W 3B2.

- 1. A completed application supplied by the Director of Admissions.
- 2. A \$100.00 non-refundable enrollment fee.
- 3. A letter of recommendation on a form supplied by the Director of Admissions to be filled out by an approved minister or other individual approved by the Director of Admissions.
- 4. A letter of recommendation from a college professor the applicant has take one or more classes with.
- 5. A full official college transcript of applicant's achievements, grades, and degree. Achievements may determine eligibility for Seminary program.
- 6. A treatise explaining why the applicant is interested and devoted to enrolling in the NW Reformed Theological Seminary. This should include virtues indicating why enrollment would be appropriate, perhaps including life goals, appropriate achievements, and moral fortitude.
- 7. A summary as to what the applicant intends to achieve by attending NW Reformed Theological Seminary.

The information provided to the Director of Admissions will determine eligibility for enrollment in the NW Reformed Theological Seminary. Clearly, the Seminary is looking for individuals with high moral character with serious interest in pursuing a theological calling.

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION

After reviewing the credentials submitted, the Seminary will notify the applicant of a decision about admission. Registration for course work is contingent upon receipt of proper documentation including transcripts indicating a required prerequisite degree - or acceptable equivalent. The NW Reformed Theological Seminary reserves the right to withdraw any acceptance, or to expel a student, if additional information or conduct indicates an applicant that does not qualify based on conduct, activities, or history that is incongruent with the mission of the Seminary.

REGISTRATION

Registration dates are posted in the academic calendar. Students are not permitted to enroll in courses after the first ten days of the Semester without special permission.

CREDIT TRANSFER

In the event that a student seeks to transfer credits from other institutions, these credits with appropriate transcripts would have to be presented for consideration by NW Reformed Theological Seminary and may allow granting of credits which could result in a reduction in necessary credits for the NW Reformed Theological Seminary. The Director of Admissions as well as relevant department chairman would oversee potential approval and granting of credits.

Though this may reduce the number of hours required at the NW Reformed Theological Semi- nary it would not alter the requirement for one year of full-time study at the Seminary to receive the Master of Divinity degree.

COURSE DISCRIPTION

NEW TESTAMENTS

Courses DISCRIPTION

New Testament Introduction (신약개론)

Covers issues related to the canon and text of the New Testament. Deals with genre, background, authorship, date, recipients, and contents of New Testament books. Introduces the student to critical views and Synoptic issues

GOSPEL (복음서)

In this course, students will do exegetical study of select passages from the Greek text of the gospels. Students can apply exegetical methodology and discussion of background issues, including historical backgrounds, composition, authorship, and distinctives of each book into their ministry.

ROMANS (로마서)

A close reading of one of Paul's most extraordinary epistles, epitomizing the gospel he preached. The student will consider issues of text, genre and literary and ancient historical context in the process of exegetically laying out Paul's Gospel and its implications for life and eternity. The purpose will be application in preaching and teaching to the modern context.

LIFE OF PAUL (바울의 생애)

The student will survey the content and unique emphases of the Pauline letters, study selected portions in detail and in full context, and apply sound hermeneutical procedures to discern the 102 essential theological contribution of these letters to the totality of biblical truth. The derivation of Paul's religious belief and the relationship of his thought to that of Jesus will be explored. Application of the results of exegesis to contemporary issues will be considered. Interaction with commentary and theological literature is included.

Book of Revelation (요한계시록)

The course will apply exegetical and hermeneutical methodology to the exposition of Revelation within an understanding of the different hermeneutical perspectives regarding the book. Particular attention will be given in interpretation to the apocalyptic genre, the Old Testament background, and the first century context of Revelation. The significance of the themes included in the book will be explored in light of the contemporary situation.

Bible EWSN (바이블동서남북)

The Bible East-West-North-South course is a process of memorizing the contents of the entire Bible by drawing key themes in writing and pictures. It is a process that helps you understand and know the core of the Bible, history,

culture, and geography.

Church History (교회사)

This course gives the student an opportunity to do focused study in a specialized area of Church History and/or Historical Theology. It will help students to broaden and deepen their knowledge of the field, challenge them to do in-depth critical research of current issues and concepts, and promote growth in skills that are relevant to the discipline.

World Religion (세계종교)

This course surveys the history, teachings and practices of the major world religions, including Hinduism, Buddhism, and Islam. Emphasis is also given to methods of effectively practicing Christian ministry in a world of religious pluralism.

SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY / MISSIONAL CHURCH

It is a process of looking at and understanding the central contents of Reformed theology in general through the basic doctrines of Christianity.

Systematic Theology I, II (조직신학)

This course surveys the issue of theological method, provides an introduction to and defense of systematic theology, and furnishes an historical survey, exegetical approach, and systematic development of Christian apologetics

Missional Church (미션얼처치)

Missional Church offers a basic introduction to the complex dynamics of the church in relation to today's culture. The study introduces the concept of missional paradigms (models for understanding the church's mission or purpose), challenges of contemporary contextualization (understanding the church's purpose in relation to theworld in which it is situated), and important elements of an "emerging church" paradigm (new ways for understatingthe church in relation to the needs of today's society)

D.Min Course.

This seminar is structured as a travel course that allows the student to spend concentrated time with a congregation that is seeking to be a missional church.

Participants will identify and develop a supportive and informative network of missional leaders and resources. Normally students will spend a week on-site with the congregation in addition to completing relevant readings and written assignments

Reformation Missional Church (변혁적 선교적교회)

It is a basic assumption of this course (seminar) that in the rapidly changing contexts of the twenty-first century, no institution, the church included, is exempt from the need for intentional transformation. This class (seminar) seeks to help students to develop a theological framework for leading a congregation through a missional process of vitalization that mutually impacts the church and its host-community. Students will investigate models of transformation based on incremental change and emerging models of transformation in response to rapid and discontinuous contextual change. Major topics to be covered include the effect of both incremental and discontinuous change on organizational revitalization, strategic planning, and organizational development. Students will use their own ministry contexts to develop skills in recognizing an organization's readiness for change, its adaptability to rapid change, analyzing a congregation's context, formulating an organization's values, purpose, and vision, setting missional priorities, and developing an infrastructure that is responsive to issues of rapid contextual change and conflict.

Incarnational Life (성육신의 삶)

The life of the incarnation is just as God came to this earth as the human Jesus, learned human language, culture, and emotions, and accomplished the work of salvation by living among humans. Through this process, you will understand what the life of the incarnation is, how to live it, and why you have to live it, and learn to adapt to life every day.

Book of Order/Creed (예배정치신조)

You will learn the worship, politics, and creeds that members of the Korean American Presbyterian Church need to know. It is also a process that pastors of other denominations who want to join the denomination must go through. 미주한인예수교 장로회의 회원들이 알아야 할 예배와 정치와 신조들을 배우게 될 것이다.

Pastoral Theology (목회학)

This course is an introduction to the theories and realities of ministry. The course will focus on the understanding of the fact that ministry is spiritual mentoring, and the study of formation of relationship between man and man, as well as man and God. With the initial study of the biblical foundation of ministry, students will then delve into the actual theories of ministry, learning how to weave existing ministerial theories and biblical ministry and apply them readily onto their own ministry.

Homiletics (설교학)

This course focuses on the development of a systematic approach to the interpretation of Scripture. Although reference is made to various interpretative systems and strategies, special attention is given to the historical-grammatical method. The predominant literary genres of the Bible are examined, and relevant principles of interpretation highlighted. Emphasis is placed on understanding the original, intended meaning of Scripture in its canonical context as the basis upon which to prepare expositions and make appropriate contemporary applications.

Church Planting & Assistant Pastor(교회개척과 전도자사역)

In this course, students will be introduced to biblical principles, best practices, latest research, and current models of church planting and assistant pastor's role through readings, discussion, lectures and church planting development assignments. Major issues a church planter faces in the first years of starting a new church will be addressed. The course covers church planting principles across the evangelical denominational spectrum and assistant pastor's ethics and their role in the Korean-American context.

Worship and Music (교회예배와 음악)

This course provides an introduction to the history of music and worship in Christian history. Emphasis is given to the history of secular and church music, the relationship between music and worship, and the history of worship in the Bible and Christianity examining important factors that have created changes in Christian worship.

Future Christian Education (미래 기독교 교육)

This course is intended to encourage each person to become the fullest development of God's people, both as individual believers and as productive members of the Body of Christ through a practical, effective, in-depth Christian Educational Ministry for now and the future.

Special Topics in Chaplaincy (채플린 사역)

This course gives the student an opportunity to study a specialized area in the field of spiritual care. Students will broaden their knowledge and practical skills in chaplaincy through interactive research and developed understanding of current issues and concepts in the ministry field.

Biblical Interpretation (성경해석학)

This course focuses on art and science of biblical interpretation. It delves into various methodologies and assumptions in hermeneutics as well as develop skills in interpreting the biblical texts. The course can be taught by team teaching.

LEADERSHIP / SPRITUALITY

Courses DISCRIPTION

Spiritual Leadership (영적 리더십)

This course focuses on how to develop and teach the principles of spiritual leadership. Topics include the Leader's challenge, role, preparation, vision, character, goal, influence, decisions, schedules, pitfalls, and rewards. Students will create visual projects and an action plan to apply biblical principles and requirements for leadership in ministry and complete a self-evaluation of their current roles and leadership styles to use in making disciples, leadership development, and church planting. In this course, we will seek to articulate a spiritual leadership and its passionate practice. Effective Christian leaders require spiritual resources and practices that will cultivate, guide, and empower the personal, corporate, and missional dimensions of their leadership.

Coaching/Spiritual Discipleship (코칭과 제자양육)

While leading remains a prerequisite to effective oversight of a ministry, equipping, mentoring, discipling and team building are the means by which effective leading occurs. Students will grow in their understanding of equipping, mentoring, discipling and team-building ministry, and develop skills in these areas, with the aim of leaving a strong leadership legacy characterized by the formation of cohesive teams

Work and Spirituality (일과 영성)

Workplaces and everyday life are the field that we are called and sent by God. This course helps students to research and understand the various meanings and practice of work and everyday life from biblical, theological, and missional perspectives. This course will help students to apply and develop their learnings from this course into their daily life. Also, this course will help students to prepare the way of their life and attitude toward both their present everyday life and the future job.

LANGUAGE

Courses DISCRIPTION

Greek (헬라어)

The student is introduced to the basic features of New Testament Greek, including grammar, vocabulary, and oral reading. The result is the ability to read the simpler portions of the New Testament with the aid of a Greek Lexicon.

Hebrew (히브리어)

This course constitutes the first half of an introduction to the elements of Hebrew grammar, with an emphasis on morphology, phonology, parsing, vocabulary building, reading, and translation of simple sentences.

Bible English (영어성경)

This is an ESL course where you learn English through the English Bible and learn the Bible together.

Church leaders must understand the global economic trends and geopolitics. This course helps to understand which countries create the order of the world and the ongoing money wars and oil wars and conflicts between countries in this era. Internship (인턴십)

Internship is a process to build a career in the ministry while serving as a minister of the church for a minimum of 3 months under the supervision of a pastor or supervisor. It is a process that must be experienced in order to graduate.

Christian Ethics (기독교윤리)

A number of prominent current social and moral issues in western culture are examined. These include ethical relativism, the question of the objectivity of moral truth, foundations of morality, tolerance, and specific moral topics such as euthanasia, genetic engineering, gay rights, environmental ethics and animal rights

Research and Writing Thesis(논문 연구)

The student will prepare an acceptable project thesis / dissertation describing the process she or he went through in deciding what topic (project) was most desirable for the place of ministry served, the primary sources used for researching the project, the theological reflection involved in the project, a description of the carrying out of the project and a critical analysis of the total project. This project dissertation will be written in acceptable style according to Turabian, 7th edition.

An exploration of methods for isolating the research topic and principles for writing an effective project proposal. The course also includes advice on the writing process.

ADVANCED PROFESSIONAL DEGREE (계획 중)

Doctor of Ministry

A student, who holds the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Master of Divinity, or their aca- demic equivalents, from approved institutions and provides attestation of effectiveness in Christian service with at least four years of experience, receives the degree of Doctor of Ministry (D. Min.) upon the completion of the prescribed program of study. The goal of the program is not merely the attainment of personal skills but also the achievement of a substantial contribution toward the advancement of the ministry.

PROVISIONAL ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

CREDENTIALS

An applicant at NW Reformed Theological Seminary must ordinarily present the following credentials to the Director of Admissions: NW Reformed Theological Seminary, 22421-1 9th South, Des Moines, WA 98188.

- 1. A completed application supplied by the Director of Admissions.
- 2. A \$300.00 non-refundable fee for consideration of enrollment.
- 3. A brief resume of the applicant's experience in ministry, including services an ordained minister.
- 4. A full official transcript of all college work, including an attestation of the attainment of Bachelor of Arts degree or its academic equivalent, and a full transcript of the applicant's theological program, including an attestation of the attainment of Master of Divinity degree or its equivalent and containing evidence of knowledge of the original language (Hebrew or Greek) of scripture. The college transcript should indicate that the college program has been devoted very largely to studies in the liberal arts.
- 5. A letter of recommendation from a former teacher in the field of practical theology. Applicants seeking admission for the pastoral counseling emphases must obtain this letter from a teacher in the field of pastoral counseling.
- 6. A letter of recommendation from the chairman of presbytery or from the applicant's supervisor under which the applicant is serving or has most recently served. This letter should attest to the applicant's Christian character and con1mitment to Christian ministry. In the case of those applying for work in pastoral counseling, it should also attest to the applicant's skills as a counselor.
- 7. A statement of the applicant's understanding of ministry and of his own call to the pastoral ministry or to a ministry in pastoral counseling or missions.

8. The Seminary may require a personal interview with a representative of the Seminary. This interview will follow evaluation of the entrance examination.

FULL ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

Applicants granted provisional approval on the basis of the above credentials are required to sustain an examination demonstrating their understanding of Reformed theology, including ability to work in the biblical languages. They will also be asked to submit a paper presenting their personal conceptions of ministry. This examination and related papers must be approved before final admission to the program is granted.

A fee of \$300.00 (advance deposit) must accompany these documents. This fee is non-refundable, unless a student is denied full admission. It is applicable to tuition only within the acade1n i c year for which admission was granted.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEGREE

As the various requirements for the Doctor of Ministry program are completed, the student will be evaluated at each point in terms of the following:

1. UNDERSTANDING

- A. The demonstration of the capacity for self-analysis and disciplinein the charge of pastoral, missionary, or counseling duties.
- B. The demonstration of the ability to assess charitably both the strengths and weaknesses of fellow workers and to understand others.
- C. The demonstration of the ability to analyze cultural patterns and to relate to such patterns in the practice of ministry.
- D. The demonstration of the ability to use theological insights in the varied aspects of a pastoral, missionary, or counseling ministry.

2. PERFORMANCE

- A. The demonstration of spiritual discipline in life and leadership.
- B. The demonstration of competence in the general skills associated with pastoral ministry, missionary labors, or counseling work.

- C. The demonstration of the competence in ministry or in counseling skills.
- D. The demonstration of the capacity to analyze a ministerial or counseling problem or opportunity with theological insight and to exercise leadership in working with others to a constructive solution or program.

3. DISSERTATION

The Academy Advisor shall encourage the student to give thought to the choice of a dissertation topic from the very beginning of the student's program. The student must submit to the Examination Committee a dissertation proposal within three years of initial registration in the program or one year from entry into the Doctor of Ministry program.

Upon approving the proposal, the Examination Committee will appoint a dissertation academy advisor and one field advisor as an additional member of the Dissertation Committee.

At least one member of a graduate school faculty other than NW Reformed Theological Seminary will be added later as an external reader upon the recommendation of the Dissertation Committee.

The Dissertation Committee will set the time for a final examination both on the dissertation and on areas of knowledge cognate with it. Faculty members meeting as a committee for this purpose shall conduct this examination, the external reader may be invited to participate. To be sustained, this examination must be approved by a majority of the faculty (dissertation advisors and reader) members present.

4. TIME LIMIT

All work for the degree of Doctor of Ministry must be completed within five years after admission to full candidacy. The student is required to maintain a general academic average 'B+' during the program of residence study

The Doctor of Ministry shall be granted only to persons enrolled at NW Reformed Theological Seminary at the time of the completion of their program of study. The degree may be received in absentia only with permission of the faculty.

ADVANCED THEOLOGICAL DEGREE

DOCTOR OF THEOLOGY

A student who holds the Bachelor of Arts Degree and a Master of Divinity degree (three years of full-time residence st udy),or the academic equivalents from an approved institution may earn the degree of Doctor of Theology (Th. D.) by completion of the prescribed program of study.

Two years of full-time residence study and a dissertation are required. The purpose of the program is to develop in a limited number of advanced students of high intellectual ability the capacity for independent inquiry and criticism required for doing original research in a particular area of theological study, teaching in a theo logical seminary or college, or providing specialized leadership in the church.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM

CREDENTIALS

A previously unregistered applicant at Washington Theological Seminary must ordinarily present the following credentials to the Director of Admissions: NW Reformed Theological Seminary, 12416 Bingham Ave. E. Tacoma, WA 98446.

- 1. A completed application supplied by the Director of Admissions.
- 2. A \$300.00 non-refundable fee for consideration of enrollment.
- 3. A statement from the applicant giving a brief history of his academic and theological preparation and indicating his reasons for wishing to pursue a program of advanced theological study and the particular area in which the applicant is interest ed, or the objective he is seeking to attain.
- 4. A full official transcript of all college work, including an attestation of the attainment of Bachelor of Arts degree or its academic equivalent, and a full transcript of the applicant's theological program, including an attestation of the attainment of theological degree (M. Div. or Th. M.) or its equivalent. Transcripts of advanced programs in the arts or sciences and in theology should also be submitted. The transcript of the theological program shall contain evidence of knowledge of the original language (Hebrew or Greek) of scripture. The applicant must also have sufficient background in the area chosen for his Doctor of Theology specialization to do advanced study in that area. The college transcript should indicate that the college program has been devoted very largely to studies in the liberal arts. Admission as candidates for the degree of Doctor of Theology will be granted only to those who have maintained an overall academic average of at least 'B' in their college and 'B+' in their seminary work.
- 5. Two letters of recommendation from former teachers in subjects closely related to the area chosen by the applicant for his Doctor of Theo logy specialization are required.
- 6. A letter of recommendation from the minister or pastor of the church of which the applicant is, a number, or other satisfactory source, stating the estimate of the writer concerning the applicant's moral character and general ability.

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION

After reviewing the credentials submitted, the Seminary will notify the applicant of the decision about admission.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DEGREE

EXAMINATION

- 1. Preliminary examinations are given in Old Testament (including Biblical Hebrew), New Testament (including New Testament Greek), Church History, Systemic Theology (including Ethics), and Apologetics. The particular departments set examination parameters. In each case, the examination may be oral, written, or both determined by the department chairman. These examinations must be attained within two years after initial registration in the Doctor of Theology (Th. D.) program. Attaining these examinations admits the student to the status of prospective candidacy. A department chairman may waive the required examinations in his department if, in his judgment, the student has already demonstrated his competence in the subjects covered by the examinations.
- 2. In addition to the language requirements stipulated for the preliminary examinations, the student must demonstrate that he has a reading knowledge of two languages designated by the Examination Committee in collaboration with the student. These examinations must be fulfilled within two years of initial registration in the Doctor of Theology program.
- 3. A student is required to inform the Registrar in writingby the beginning of any semester of any courses he is taking during that semester at another graduate school that are a part of this program. Failure to do so may result in the refusal of NW Reformed Theological Seminary to count these courses toward degree requirements.

DISSERTATION

The Residence Advisor shall encourage the student to give thought to the choice of a dissertation topic from the very beginning of the student's program. The student must subn1it to the Examination Committee a dissertation proposal within one year of initial registration in the Advanced Theological Degree program or within four years of entering the Washington Theological Serr1inary working in the pre-Doctoral program.

Upon approving the student's proposal, the Examination Committee will appoint a Dissertation Advisor and two additional members of the Dissertation Committee.

At least one mem- ber of a graduate school faculty other than NW Reformed Theological Seminary will be added later as an external reader upon the recommendation of the Dissertation Committee. Upon approving the dissertation, the Dissertation Committee will set the time for a final examination both on the dissertation as well as on knowledge cognate with it. Faculty members meeting as a committee for this purpose shall conduct this examination and the outside reader may be invited to attend as well. To be endorsed this examination must be approved by a majority of the faculty members present. The dissertation must be a contribution to the knowledge of the subject worthy of publication and must show the candidate's ability to conduct independent research, to deal constructively with theological problems, and to communicate clearly and effectively in written English and/or Korean.

TIME LIMIT

All work for the degree of Doctor of Theology must be completed within five years after admission to full candidacy. The student is required to maintain a general academic average of 'B+' during the program of residence study.

The Doctor of Ministry shall be granted only to persons enrolled at North-West Theological Seminary at the time of the completion of their program of study. The degree may be received in absentia only with permission of the faculty.
